ABOUT THE COLLABORATION IN TEACHING AND LEARNING (CTL) TANKETTE

The CTL Tankette is one part of SICTAS's national symposium. You can find out more about SICTAS and the associated activities at the education.au website (www.educationau.edu.au).

The CTL Tankette is an online 'think tank' event. It has two components: firstly, an open online group for broad discussion around the issues and ideas and; secondly, a 1.5 hour online 'tankette talk' with around 10 by-invitation guests contributing to the discussion from differing perspectives. The recording of the 'tankette talk' will be made publicly available to the broader group to stimulate further discussion.

The role of the CTL Tankette is to:

- NOW: investigate the use of collaborative tools and methodologies in teaching and learning in all sectors of education as it happens now.
- FUTURE: investigate emergent collaborative methodologies and technologies in teaching and learning, focusing on general or specific shifts, issues and innovations that may impact on the use and provision of collaborative methodologies, and looking to what is on the horizon and beyond.
- ISSUES AND CHALLENGES: investigate the policy issues and challenges for education and training in using collaborative methodologies and technologies, focusing on the following areas:
 - Features and tools that contribute to the success of collaborative methodologies
 - Identity management
 - Privacy
 - Safety
 - Content control and monitoring
 - Intellectual property
 - Behaviour
 - Moderation/Facilitation skills
 - Teacher training and professional development
